TIPS 'N TRICKS

If you are fabricating something for one side of the car and will have to make another for the opposite side of the car, do not just make the second one the same (or a 'mirror' image) as the first <u>until you have measured the second side too</u>. Cars are rarely the same side-to-side, and the second part will most likely be slightly different.

When trying to undo a harmonic balancer/crank bolt put a breaker bar on the bolt head & locate it on the frame rail or ground & turn the engine over on the key. Works every time.

Bothered by gnats & mosquitos in the Spring & Summer...Wipe your face with a dryer sheet. Keep a few tucked in your shirt pocket... Really...come on guys, give me a break...this ain't another dryer sheet joke...this really works AAANNNDDD if you're not afraid of catching Hell from your Neanderthal type friends...raid the wife's stash of Skin-So-Soft lotion (Avon makes it,)...really smells good & keeps the gnats & mosquitos away...plus ya don't want to smell like beer & gasoline ALL the time...




