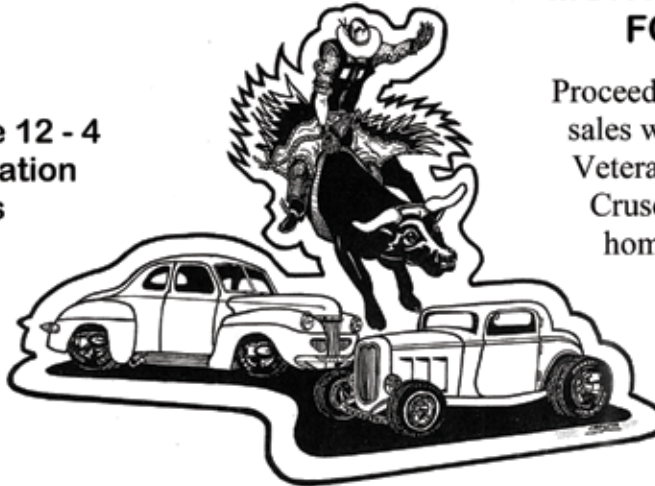

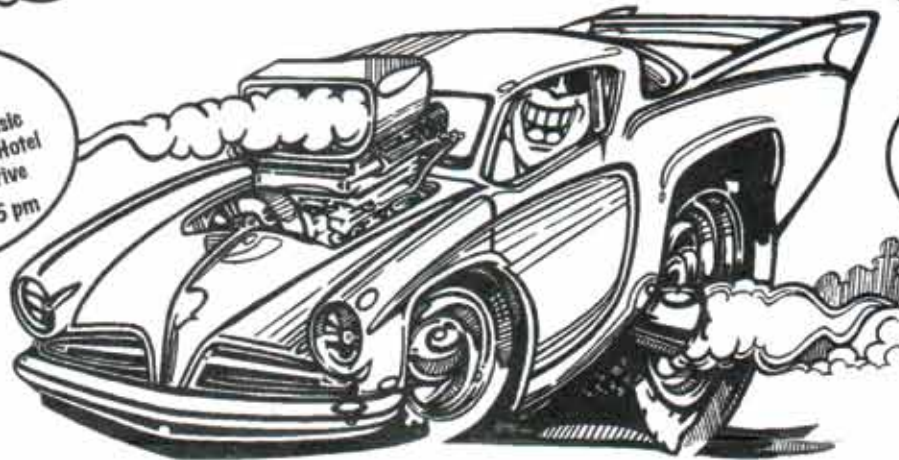

THE EFFECTS OF APPRECIATION AND INFLATION ON COLLECTOR CAR INSURANCE

It is well-known that Grundy's Agreed Value insurance does not make deductions for age of a vehicle or expected "wear and tear" when evaluating a loss. (If anything, we understand that there is a greater likelihood that your collector vehicle's value will increase over time, as the car and its parts become rarer.) In case of a total loss, a Grundy policyholder is guaranteed the Agreed Value that is established at the inception of their policy.

As the values of collector vehicles rise, we invite our customers to contact our office to increase the Agreed Value coverage limits on their policies; however, we understand that sometimes customers may not think to increase their vehicle's coverage, and sometimes the value of a vehicle may appreciate more rapidly than expected.

With an ever-changing market, the cost to repair or replace your collector car can change at any time. To protect customers and to offer coverage for the current market value of their vehicles, Grundy's insurance policies include extra "peace of mind" protection that account for market appreciation and inflation.

The Inflation Guard on Standard Collector Car Policies

Grundy collector car policies have a built in Inflation Guard, which in recent years has automatically increased the insured value of your vehicle(s) by 4%. This increase is shown on your policy at each renewal and is reflected in a small premium increase for the added coverage.

Although the Inflation Guard works adequately to cover the increased cost of repair and market appreciation on most cars, extremely rare and valuable cars are often appreciating much faster than other collector's in the market place. For this reason, many of Grundy's large collectors are provided a "Collections Policy" which provides "peace of mind" and up to 150% of the value at which their car is insured.

The Collections Policy Alternative


When a new policy is written, owners should understand the values of their cars and always insure them for their "current market value". If unsure of the value of a vehicle, research can be done on recent sales of similar vehicles, and Grundy's underwriters can be consulted on valuation. Once the value is determined and the Agreed Value is established, the policy is issued accordingly. Thereafter, in cases of very rare cars, a single auction sale can dramatically reestablish the value of a vehicle. This is particularly common in vehicles with extremely limited production and performance or cars with race history.

Owners are not expected to continually "watch" the market to reevaluate their cars after every similar sale; to protect our customers, the Grundy Collections Policy offers up to 150% of the Agreed Value in the event of a total loss.

For example, at inception of a policy, an owner and Grundy agreed that their rare Ferrari should be insured for \$1 million. Tragically, the car was destroyed in a fire just two months after the policy was issued. At this point, if research revealed that a similar Ferrari in similar condition had sold for \$1.2 million, the owner

could receive a settlement for the newly established value. (Note that we do not recommend underinsuring your vehicles, and the Collections Policy's 150% Valuation Clause does not apply if a vehicle is knowingly underinsured at the policy's inception.)

The 150% Valuation Clause can apply at any time during a current or future policy renewal, meaning it can be two months (as in our example) or two years later. And, there is no additional premium for this benefit!

- An electric fence powerful enough to kill a dinosaur will cause no lasting damage to an eight year old child.
- It is not necessary to say hello or goodbye when beginning or ending phone conversations.
- Even when driving down a perfectly straight road, it is necessary to turn the steering wheel vigorously from left to right every few moments.
- The Eiffel Tower can be seen from any window in Paris.
- You're very likely to survive any battle in any war – unless you make the mistake of showing someone a picture of your sweetheart back home.
- ***And the best for last.....***A man will show no pain while taking the most ferocious beating, but will wince when a woman tries to clean his wounds.

- Fan belt squeak? Take it off, turn it around and reinstall. Squeak is gone.
- Using vacuum tubing on the end of a spark plug to start it in tight places.
- Keep a container for saving all the oddball and OEM fasteners, clips, retainers, pins, washers, etc. that are in good condition off of junk parts or cars. They can help you out of a jam with future repairs/projects ... if you find the piece that works, you've saved some cash or have one to show the guy at your parts and fastener supply when you need more.
- When working under the car on concrete, a large piece of heavy cardboard (think sofa or appliance carton) flattened works better than a mechanic's creeper. It insulates, gives you a few more inches of working room, and is easier to move around on than fighting with the creeper. Best of all, it's free ... check behind furniture stores, etc.
- This is how you can find stud size when you know wrench size. Example: 9/16 wrench is a 3/8 stud. 1/2 inch wrench is a 5/16 stud. Just subtract 3/16 from your wrench size to get the stud size. Always use 3/16 as the common denominator. Works with all sizes. And of course it works going from stud size to wrench size (will not work with 12 point bolts or nuts).
- To remove tension spring, open the hood/trunk to the highest point, slip in washers between the springs, wrap in duct tape, so they don't fly apart and slowly close, the spring ends will slip out easily, reverse to install.
- To check a radiator especially out of the car, take a bicycle tire tube, cut it in half, attach the radiator outlets to the cut ends of the tube, install the radiator cap. Now you can apply air pressure through the air valve in the bike tube and check for leaks.
- Here is how to gap your points if you were stuck along the side of the road without a feeler gauge. Check the thickness specs of various brands of beer can tabs. I think Lucky was .016".
