The meeting was called to order at 2:08 pm in the east side gazebo of Clark's Park at the Pioneer Street Rods Carousel Cruise car show in Butte, Montana. President Gary Taylor presided at this meeting.

The membership book was passed among those present for their signatures. There were 14 members present and 3 guests.

Committee Reports:

Steve Sorg, committee chair of the Scholarship Committee, asked about the scholarship program continuing. Members and business sponsors have been contributing this year as in past years. Will we be giving out two scholarships? Do we need to rethink how we handle the scholarship program?

TIPS 'N TRICKS

When the shop sink, tub or shower drains slow, a shop vac will usually suck it clean in about 10 seconds. Have needle nose pliers handy. Take the filter off first.

Dropped a hard contact lens down a hotel drain years ago. The hotel maintenance guy showed up with a shop vac and borrowed a sock from me to put over the nozzle and sucked the lens out of the drain. Huh!

To keep it on track for automotive use, you can do a lot of the same things with a shop vac. I used one the other day to drain a heater core before pulling it out through the interior. I drained all the antifreeze out with no fuss and then no drips on the new carpet.

I removed a headliner last year that had several mouse nests in it. Made slits and stuck the shop vac in to suck the nastiness out before tearing the headliner out. Saved me from making a huge mess. (Always wear a mask etc. when handling mouse nests)

Clean everything. Any old part you're going to re-use, clean it first. Any area you're working in, clean it. New parts straight out of the package, clean off any residue from manufacturing and shipping. Clean parts work better than dirty parts.

The little reds tubes for carb or brake cleaner fit nicely into termite holes. Give it a blast and it fills the galleys and you'll often see it come out a hole 6 inches away.

I like to heat my bearings to make them go on the shaft easier, an old trick that all of us know, but the way I do it is the trick. I place the bearing on my old incandescent drop light and take a break. In about twenty minutes the bearing is the right temperature to press on.





How To Make The Flame Thrower "Control Box"


- Cut a piece roughly 12" long of each color wire. You should have five (5) pieces of wire in five (5) different colors.
- 2. Crimp the terminal connectors on one end of each of the five (5) wires.
- Connect the GREEN wire to #87A on the relay.
- 4. Connect the YELLOW wire to #87 on the relay.
- Connect the BLACK wire to #86 on the relay.
- 6. Connect the RED wire to #85 on the relay.
- 7. Connect the BLUE wire to #30 on the relay.
- 8. Drill a 1/2" hole into one end of the project box. Insert the rubber grommet.
- Feed the unused ends of the five (5) wires through the grommet and secure the box top.
- 10. Attach a wire connector to each of the five (5) wires.






How To Install the Flame Thrower Exhaust System

- Find a location for the Control Box under the dashboard, on the firewall, etc. Mount it securely.
- 2. Locate your vehicle's existing coil.
- Connect a wire from the negative terminal on your vehicle's coil to the GREEN wire on the Control Box.
- Connect the wire that was disconnected from the vehicle's coil negative terminal to the BLUE wire from the Control Box.
- Locate an ignition wire (has power when you turn on the ignition). Connect the RED wire from the Control Box to this wire.
- Mount the <u>Momentary Switch</u>. Connect one terminal to vehicle ground. Connect the other terminal to the BLACK wire from the Control Box.
- Mount the coil(s) along your frame rail, or wherever makes sense on your vehicle.
- Drill a hole roughly six (6) inches behind your exhaust or muffler for the spark plug bung. Weld into place.
- 9. Run a wire from your car battery to the positive terminal of each coil.
- 10. Run a wire from the negative side of each coil to the YELLOW wire from the Control Box.
- 11. Start your vehicle. Keep the vehicle in Park (or neutral). Rev the engine up and press and hold the switch. The engine should begin to stall and viola, Flame Throwing Exhaust!







